
FAUNISTIC RECORDS FROM THE CZECH REPUBLIC – 319

Lepidoptera: Tortricidae

Pammene juniperana (Millière, 1858). Bohemia sept.: Brná nad Labem (5350, 50°37'44"N, 14°04'29"E), 230 m a.s.l., 13.–14.iv.2007, 2 ♂♂ at light, I. Novák lgt., det. et coll. Distributed mainly in South Europe, a rare species in Germany (Thüringen), also known from Switzerland, Romania and Eastern Europe (Razowski 2001, 2003). Its introduction with horticulture (fashionable juniper cultivars) is not excluded. The imagines fly very early, with two generations per year (iii–iv, vi–vii), the caterpillars live in the fruits of juniper (*Juniperus communis*). New species for the Czech Republic.
